1. Welcome, Advice on Public Delegations for Consideration

Sarah Solter welcomed the committee.

No requests for public delegations at this time.

No additions or deletions to the agenda at this time.

Lorenzo Alfano introduced to the committee GFL Representatives joining on the call. Both Mr. Richmond and Mr. Carmichael gave a brief background of themselves and their role at GFL. Mr. Richmond let the committee know the Stoney Creek Regional Facility will continue to operate as it is with all staff remaining the same at the site. Once Terrapure Environmental changes its name to GFL Environmental a mailer will be sent out to the surrounding community to advise of the ownership and name change.

2. Matters Arising from June 2021 Meeting

New Candidate Opportunities:

To-date there has been no interest from the local community to fill the open community positions. An ad was placed in the Stoney Creek News in August but to-date there has been no interest.

UPDATE: There was an oversight on the Administrator's part and the ad for "New CLC Members" was not sent to the Stoney Creek News in August, an ad will be placed in the November 4th edition of the Stoney Creek News. The SC News is not the only means of advertising for Community members, there is a paragraph on the main page of the CLC's webpage "Looking for New CLC Member" which also gives contact information for interested neighbours.

3. Site Update:

Quarterly Update of Operational Activities at the Landfill:

Site activity has been steady over the past 3 months. Current incoming volumes are from regular baseline customers (primarily AMD) and construction event volumes. The Stoney Creek Regional Facility is conducting several phases of construction, which include material relocation, landfill capping and cell/liner construction.

Review of Monitoring: *Particulate Matter (PM10)*

June 2021 – 8 MECP 1 HR average exceedances and 1 daily average exceedances

- Exceedances due to construction along Green Mountain Road and movement of clean fill close to PM10 station.

July 2021 – 10 MECP 1 HR average exceedances and 0 daily average exceedances

- Exceedance due to movement of clean fill close to PM10 station, earthmoving to southwest berm parallel to Mud St.

Aug 2021 – 2 MECP 1 HR average exceedances and 0 daily average exceedances

- Exceedances due to south-west berm construction and offsite construction not related to the landfill.

Review of Complaints:

Nothing to report.

Status of Applications Pending with the MECP:

The SCRF submitted the design and specifications for phase 9 cell/liner construction on May 12, 2021 to MECP. SCRF received approval on July 23, 2021.

Heritage Green Community Trust Activities Update:

The Trust will resume meetings on September 20, 2021. To-date there is nothing new to report.

4. New Business:

Lorenzo Alfano brought up the terms as set out in the ECA since interest from the community has depleted. The CLC is currently having issues with quorum when there are not enough voting members in attendance. Mr. Alfano made a suggestion to send the quarterly updates via e-mail to the current CLC members with holding one meeting per year. CLC members can request a meeting at any time should they feel it is necessary.

Sarah Solter noted the committee has not been receiving any complaints or concerns from the community. Councillor Pearson has not heard of any issues regarding the company. Councillor Clark said when any complaints do arise his office will forward to both Terrapure and the MECP immediately. To-date there have been no complaints received.

Kim Bailey will forward a link to the 2020 Annual Report Highlights document once we receive it from our Consultants. Should anyone have any questions, please forward to Kim via e-mail and the responses will be included with the quarterly update on December 6, 2021.
