2. Matters Arising from December 2020 Meeting

New Candidate Opportunities:

MECP Response from Water Department on Odour Issue:

Stephen Burt spoke with the Drinking Water Department of the MECP and will follow up with Councillor Clark's office.

3. Site Update:

Quarterly Update of Operational Activities at the Landfill:

Site activity has been moderate over the past 3 months. Current incoming volumes are from regular baseline customers (primarily AMD) and small construction event volumes.

Review of Monitoring: Particulate Matter (PM10)

Dec. 2020 – 0 MOE 1 HR average exceedances and 0 daily average exceedances

Jan. 2021 – 0 MOE 1 HR average exceedances and 0 daily average exceedances

Feb. 2021 – 2 MOE 1 HR average exceedances and 0 daily average exceedances

- Exceedances were on the 15th & 16th, Terrapure SCRF was not a contributing factor.
- Winds out of the north – northeast.

Vince Ramelli inquired on how quickly does Terrapure get alerts when there are exceedances and how specific are the notifications? Lorenzo Alfano explained alerts are sent from Rotek immediately with a full detailed report the following day.

Review of Complaints:

Status of Applications Pending with the MECP:

We received approval for technical specifications & drawings for final cover from the MECP on February 23, 2021. Terrapure will be submitting the design and specifications for phase 9 cell/liner construction in early April.

Heritage Green Community Trust Activities Update:

The Trust met, via WebEx, with the City of Hamilton regarding projects at the Heritage Green Sports, Passive and Leash Free Dog Parks. The Wheel Chair Swing is currently on hold until next year as the project is currently in the "Pilot" phase at Gage Park. Once all the issues are addressed, a swing can be installed at Heritage Green.

The Trust is now accepting Grant and Scholarship Applications with the deadline date of April 1st.

The Trust will receive the annual royalty payment from Terrapure on March 31, 2021 in the amount of \$682,548.06

4. New Business:

Each community member was asked to "Declare their Residency" as it states in the Terms of Reference. Each member had confirmed they live in Upper Stoney Creek within a 1.5 km radius of the Stoney Creek Regional Facility.

Mary Chedumbarum-Ramasamy inquired about the drainage issues at the Dog Park as it is extremely muddy at the site. Lorenzo Alfano advised it is the City of Hamilton who maintains all the park lands across from the SCRF. Lorenzo did advise Mary the City is aware of the issue and it is on their radar for repair as soon as possible.
