Community Liaison Committee 2016 Highlights

Terrapure Environmental owns and operates the Stoney Creek Regional Facility located at the northwest corner of Mud Street and Upper Centennial Parkway in Upper Stoney Creek. The Facility receives solid, non-hazardous residual materials from industrial operations like steel producers and infrastructure projects for final disposal.

What is the CLC?

The Terrapure Community Liaison Committee (CLC) is a group of local citizen members and representatives from Terrapure, the City of Hamilton and the Ministry of the Environment and Climate Change that meets quarterly. The CLC, representing the community of Upper Stoney Creek, provides an opportunity for two-way dialogue between Terrapure Environmental and the local community with regards to the Terrapure Stoney Creek Regional Facility.

What is the CLC's Mandate?

To facilitate communication between Terrapure and the community about the operation of the site and to facilitate the addressing of community concerns about the operation of the site.

The CLC fulfills its mandate by:

- Providing a focal point for the exchange of information relevant to the operation of the site
- Reviewing, commenting and making recommendations on operating and monitoring reports and on applications for new or revised approvals pertaining to the site
- Reviewing, commenting on and making recommendations toward the resolution of community complaints and the procedure for addressing issues received

The CLC reviewed the terms and history of the Stoney Creek Regional Facility's two community investment programs. \$1 per tonne of residual material received at the facility goes to the City of Hamilton royalty program and \$1 per tonne of residual material goes to the Heritage Green Community Trust.
