**1. Welcome, Advice on Public Delegations for Consideration**

**2. Matters Arising from March 2019 Meeting**

**Election of Committee Chair**

With the departure of Brad Hart, a new Chairperson needs to be elected. After some discussion on the requirements the community members asked for time to consider the position. By the end of the meeting, Sarah Solter put her name forth to take on the role as Chair for the committee. The members voted and Ms. Solter was accepted as the new Chair for the CLC.

### **Outcome from CLC Candidate Interview**

The members interviewed an interested candidate for the open community position. After a few days, the person had to rescind their application due to scheduling conflicts. The CLC has a full complement of community members now that Sarah Solter is a full member.

A community position will come available after the September meeting therefore the members have asked Kim Bailey to forward an electronic copy of the advertisement. The community members will start speaking to friends and neighbours who might be interested.

### **Update on remaining capacity**

Lorenzo Alfano let the CLC know the Stoney Creek Regional Facility still has capacity to receive waste.

### **EA status update**

Terrapure's Environmental Assessment submission will be posted on the MECP's website as well as on the SCRF website. This is the start of the 5-week review period for the public and all stakeholders to make comments. Once this is complete, the document will be sent to the Minister's office for review and a final decision.

## **3. Site Update:**

### **Quarterly Update of Operational Activities at the Landfill:**

Site activity has been moderate in the past 3 months. Current incoming volumes are from regular baseline customers with little to no event projects.

### **Review of Monitoring:**

#### ***Particulate Matter (PM10)***

March 2019 – 3 MOE 1 HR average exceedances and 0 daily average exceedances

April 2019 – 0 MOE 1 HR average exceedances and 0 daily average exceedances

May 2019 – 1 MOE 1 HR average exceedances and 0 daily average exceedances

March – arterial road traffic around the facility

April – No exceedances

May – fugitive dust due to high winds

## **Review of Complaints:**

March 22<sup>nd</sup> – 1 – odour complaint – landfill was not operational. The odour was actually detected a month previous on Feb 20<sup>th</sup> but reported in March.

April 9<sup>th</sup> -1 odour – Landfill was not operational and the wind direction shows the odour did not come from the site.

May 3<sup>rd</sup> – 1 odour – complaint from May 2<sup>nd</sup>. Landfill was not operational and the wind direction shows the odour did not come from the site.

The Community Members inquired about the construction along First Road W and how it affects truck traffic. Lorenzo Alfano explained the Trucks still exit from the First Road West gate and now turn right and will drive down Green Mountain Road.

## **Heritage Green Community Trust Activities Update:**

The Heritage Green Community Trust held their Annual General Meeting last Monday May 27<sup>th</sup>. This year the Trust awarded \$677,781.48 in grants and \$30,000.00 in scholarships for 12 local students. The Trust Indenture has been updated and will now be increasing the number of community members by two. An ad will be placed in the Stoney Creek News this summer looking for candidates.
